

Transitional Housing


The majority of the Transitional Housing beds for individuals in Berks County have a recovery elements associated with them.



Permanent Supportive Housing


There are more units for individuals in permanent supportive housing however there are a comparable number of beds or individuals and families.






The majority of veterans were served as individuals without accompanying children in emergency shelter.


Length of Stay Transitional Housing
