Ranking Process for PA-506

The following procedure will be used for ranking all Continuum of Care Programs operated within Berks County, PA-506.

The Ranking and Scoring Process was approved by unanimous vote by the Board of Directors of the Continuum of Care via email on August 25th, 2017.

The final ranking of all CoC programs will be posted on the Berks Coalition to End Homelessness, Inc. website www.bceh.org prior to the submission of the Collaborative Application.

- All CoC-funded programs will be ranked according to the attached scoring sheet.
- The Data Analyst for the CoC will score each program according to the weighted sheet.
- Participation attendance will be kept and maintained by the CoC.
- Strategic Objectives data will be collected from HMIS.
- Bed Utilization numbers will be collected from the annual Housing Inventory Sheet.
- Any disagreement with ranking is to be brought to the attention of the Executive Leadership of BCEH.
- Any program that scores below Tier One (as determined by HUD funding levels) will be notified in writing by the Executive Leadership of BCEH.
- Programs that score below Tier One run the risk of being reallocated to another priority project within the CoC, such as Rapid Rehousing, according to the Reallocation Policy.
- This document, and its priorities, will be reviewed annually and updated according to HUD priorities.
